SSC Code of Conduct

It is the policy of Shustoke Sailing Club that all members show respect and understanding for each other and treat everyone equally within the context of the sport. The aim is for all participants to enjoy their sport and to improve performance.

Abusive language, swearing, intimidation, aggressive behaviour or lack of respect for others and their property will not be tolerated and may lead to disciplinary action.

- Respect other participants, coaches, instructors, club officials, volunteers and other club members
- Abide by the rules and play fairly
- The club only operates by members volunteering. Support the club by involvement in club duties and other activities
- Respect the clubs facilities and equipment
- Try to always leave the club, its equipment and facilities, tidier and in better condition than when you arrived

Young Sailors

- Listen to and accept what you are asked to do to improve your performance and keep you safe.
- Take care of all property belonging to other participants, the Club and its members
- Never bully others either in person, by phone, by text or online

Parents

- Take responsibility for your Childs safety and conduct in and around the clubhouse and encourage your child to do the same
- Inform the club or event organisers of up to date relevant medical information
- Ensure that your child wears suitable clothing and has appropriate food and drink
- Provide up to date contact details and be available at the Sailing Club when you child is present
- Support your child's involvement and help them enjoy the sport
- Praise your child's good performance, not just results
- Respect and support the coaches
- Assist your child rigging and de-rigging boats at each end of the session and ensure that boats are in good condition, correctly stowed and ready for future use
- Accept officials judgements and recognise good performance by all participants
- Use established procedures where there is a genuine concern or dispute
- Support the club by involvement in club duties and activities

Coaches, Instructors, Officials and Volunteers

- Consider the welfare and safety of participants before the development of performance
- Encourage participants to value their performance and not just results
- Promote fair play and never condone cheating
- Ensure that all activities are appropriate to the age, ability and experience of those taking part
- Avoid unnecessary physical contact with young people
- Be an excellent role model and display consistently high standards of behaviour and appearance
- Be aware of any relevant medical information
